- III. **Special Presentations by Baker College, Kettering University, and Mott Community College.** They will be briefly talking about what they are doing to reduce underage drinking. One of the people mentioned that they have a lot of policies; however, they do not have a specific drug and alcohol prevention program. They also don't have any licensed counseling with respect to alcohol and drugs. This person also mentioned that they don't have a lot of alcohol violations and that policies are reactive.

Baker College – 13 campuses throughout Michigan. Each campus is on their own regarding infractions. We do not have system wide procedure in place. 335 students living on Fenton/Bristol Rd campus. He would like some resources to assist. Jeannie

Clery Act. Requires every higher ed institute to report their crime statistics. The handbook is 285 pages. Provide alcohol awareness training on each campus. Average age of student is 28.

Mott Community College – Terry Love. Student Success Specialist. All licensed with LPC. Worked previously at Kettering for 25 years and ran their prevention program. Our alcohol and drug prevention programs are headed under are safety. It should be under the. We have a Mott Middle Campus (alternative h.s.) for age 14 - 18 and then they graduate with a high school diploma and associate degree. WE do take people that are on the sex offender list. The Code of Conduct Violations. About 25 items that can get you in trouble. Our biggest issue now is marijuana as well as several heroin cases. Gateway Program is for people aged 16-24 who don't have a high school diploma. They receive a high school diploma and associate degree. A work shop every now and then is not enough. Mott has their own police department and jail. 35 sworn police officers on campus. Smokefree campus.

Prudence/Amanda – Kettering University – All freshman must live on campus. 3 mo on campus and 3 mo co op. 13 fraternities and 6 sororities. Population just over 2,000 per term. We are a dry campus but we do have our issues. We do have 17 year olds. Freshman do have cars on campus. 15:1 men to women. The Wellness Center handles all of the alcohol programs. Developed based on risk and protective factors. Age appropriate for them. Alcohol edu – online training course before students come on campus. Awareness tables. Every term mandatory awareness event. Alcohol screenings with fraternities and sororities. Freshman orientation every 3 months. Outside speakers come in. A comedian, a female presented last year.

Amanda – contracted with Kettering to operate a SAP. 24/7 800 number to call and talk with a counselor at any time. 20 hours/week. Limited License Professional Counselor.

Amy Bishop – St. Clair county – meeting with local middle school went well. They approved the safety program for 8th graders and will providing it in May.

Don Granger – New Paths intern. Person in recovery. Distributed surveys. Odyssey house recovery program. Lost 6 of our members to heroin last year.

Heady – C.C prevention programming in 11 sites mainly in Genessee County. Mr. Rogers program is in 6 different sites. Shiawassee in working in 9 different sites. Use MI model for health.

Aurora – Hope Network. SAFETY class. Preventive parenting classes. Classes in the jail and in the agency.

CPS worker that works with Judge Beagle. Heroin is big and Rx Drugs.

Ken Briggs – Meridian Health services – new classes based out of waterfrod.

Sandra – working with students on bullying prevention.

Mary Thomas – adm. For salvation army. Anyone can refer to our program regardless of county and there is no cost to them.

Greg – I hire a lot of young people in the summer time. Close to 86 young people. Train them in urban gardening. Several sites throughout the county. Thursdays and asturady they ssell produce at the flint farmers market. Took some kids to the Michigan Farmers Conference recently. The Mr. Rogers Program recently received an award from MFC. We received the farmer of the year award. Botvin Life Skills program during the school year.
