II. Approval of January 26, 2016 meeting minutes and correction will be made to the February 24, 2015 MCRUD Meeting. Lisa Peoples-Hurst will be added to the meeting minutes.

Motion by Heady, supported by Ken. Motion unanimously carried.

III. Presentation on Alcohol Vendor Education

Marilyn Lorenz from the Lapeer Co. Health Department presented a PowerPoint on their alcohol vendor education program. She goes and visits alcohol retailers in the county. There are over 100 liquor license holders in Lapeer Co and she has visited all but 2. Marilyn passed out a handout from www.michigantrafficroashfacts.org that ranked each Michigan county by the number of crashes, fatal crashes, etc. Lapeer Co is ranked #12. Marilyn said she discusses the Dram Shop Act to retailers and explains to them that by law they (server/owner) can be held liable if they do not make a reasonable effort to keep an intoxicated person from driving in the event that person kills someone else. She encouraged retailers to keep a journal of unusual incidences. She also noted that some retailers sell drug paraphernalia which is against the law for liquor licensees. Marilyn also does TIPS or SafeServe training for new licensees. By law one person per shift must be trained for ON premise sales.

trafficking. Forming workgroup with sheriff and FBI. Continues to give parenting, anger management, grief & loss, self-esteem, and substance abuse programs in the schools.

Holly West- Catholic Charities. Works in Lapeer Co. Coordinating with Families Against Narcotics (FAN) and the Great Start Coalition.

Kenneth Briggs-Meridian Health Service (Region 10). Doing a workshop on Co-Occurring Disorders on March 9th at Common Ground in Oakland Co.

Lisa Folkler & Laura Dyszlewski- GAAP Coalition. Working toward 501(c)3 status and creating a board. They are now located at Remidy Exchange 902 E. 6th St.

Todd Anglebrandt- Working in the Lapeer jail with an active journaling program.

Janine Kravetz- Sacred Heart Rehabilitation Center. March 12th is a Fit Fair at the Boys & Girls Club. March 5th is a Sock Hop. March 20 the coalition will have a float in the St. Paddys Day Parade. April 2nd is a Coffee Crawl supported by a recovery group. March 1 is a Heroin Summit in Essexville at Garbber HS.

Mike Tobias- Prevention Network. Anonymous People movie showing on March 17th at Celebration Cinema. There is a recovery rally with guest author in September.

Karra Thomas-(DWMHA). March 22nd is the first day for naloxone kit training for first responders. April 20th is the Underage Drinking Town Hall at Wayne County Community College in Detroit. Over 400 people attended the Opioid Summit on Feb. 10th. Presentations are available at www.dwmha.com

Mark Kilgore- Works with 9 coalitions and the Greater Macomb project box. Has program where high school students educate 5th graders about tobacco. Working on town halls, Anonymous People showing in recovery homes. Health & Wellness Fair July 18th. Sober Cruise on Detroit Princess later this year.

Nate Anderson & Annalyse Ellis-Substance Abuse Task Force of St. Joseph County. New take back box installed in St. Joes county. Working on establishing Naloxone training.

Lisa Peoples-Hurst. Using Michigan Model curriculum to teach ATOD lessons to 5th graders, partnering with RESA. Offering TIPS training. Naloxone now at Sheriffs Depart.

Heady Gist-Catholic Charities. Heady gave special thanks to everyone for their support during the Flint water crisis.

Mike referenced Crains Detroit Business article. Both Lisa Fockler and Ken Briggs expressed concerns about where prevention dollars would be going.
Mike Tobias referenced the Michigan Association of Community Mental Health Boards.

 - ii. The Comprehensive Addiction & Recovery Act (CARA). Feb. 12 passed Senate Judiciary
Karra said that persons who attended the CADCA Forum in D.C. advocated strongly to advance the CARA bill
