II. Approval of October 27, 2015 meeting minutes

Motion by Ashley, support by Jim Gallant. Motion unanimously carried. Jim expressed interest in reviewing by laws.

III. Presentation by Sgt. Ken Pelland – Grosse Ile Police Department - “Downriver Party Patrol Task Force.”

Identify a large scale party; learned how to approach the house; and learned how to set up an assembly line to process minors. We could safely disperse a party of 60 in about 1.5 hours. Previously took 8 hours for 5 guys. Specialized training to expedite the process, started in 2002.

Grosse Ile was lead agency. Flatrock, Brownstown, and a few other agencies were involved. Every officer has a specific task.

The task force screens everyone for alcohol consumption and this is done quickly.

As we received more funding from OHSP...to include 12 law enforcement agencies and incorporate MSP and Wayne County Sheriff's Office. Added a marine division. High schools held assemblies every fall. Started to branch out with the SUDDS Coalition and other organizations to help develop some media campaigns so parents could learn about our campaigns.

To date we have issued over 700 MIP tickets in 13 years. We were able to deal with the backlash from parents.

Officers learned more and as a result more citations are issued.

Started doing decoy compliance checks operations. When we started the rate was 40% now we are at 18%. An education piece goes with it. They share info with SUDDS coalition so a f/u letter can be sent.

Do all the law enforcement agencies share results with MLCC? Yes, we automatically send in a violation report to MLCC.

Social Media – we began in 2002 when social media wasn't much of a problem. Ken has developed a facebook character and has over 1000 friends. This helps law enforcement track a sexual assault of a 6 year old. Track parties.

We've gone to apartments, a barn location, pulled over a party bus that had about 20 kids on it. Driver was cited with about 18 counts of contributing to the delinquency of a minor. It's not just your typical house party that we conduct party patrols on. Islands in the Detroit river.

Working with schools to get key dates.

Are there any social ordinance laws in the community? We have a local ordinance that mirrors state law.

The task force is governed by a mutual aid agreement. Similar to a SWAT team.

Ken reported that there may be other party patrols or past party patrols in East Lansing, Kalamazoo, Holland, Marquette, and Detroit.

IV. Brief Round table Reports

Amy Bishop – St. Clair Co. – doing some naloxone training in the community. Billboards in the schools and preparing for prom time.

Ashley Bergeon _ Kalamazoo. April 17 sticker shock event. Starting to plan for youth action summit in August. Interact with lawmakers and policymakers and breakouts.

Achilles/Annalyse– St. Joseph County – recently awarded partnership for success grant. Focus of grant is uad and rx drug abuse for ages 12-25. One focus area is on the development on partnerships with the primary healthcare sector to do some screenings. SBIRT model and implement some specific interventions for the indicated population.

Nathan – St. Joseph County – Working on the Rx drug abuse campaign.

Achilles – working very diligently to implement a naloxone program. A Double target: law enforcement and emergency responders all 8 counties, providing training and kits. Also hired an agency, Families Against Narcotics. Local chapter will provide training to people who are addicted and to their families.

Melanie – Henry Ford – we have been assisting the SUDDS Coalition in holding Parents 360 meetings. Will be looking at new dates for 2016.

Karra Thomas – Detroit Wayne Mental Health Authority – planning 2nd annual faith based conference in May or June, “Wellness Beyond the Walls” conference. Drug Facts Week events going on. Town hall meetings are planned. February 10 an Opioid Summit (\$40 charge, 5 MCBAP hours)

Ty – Gratiot County – Gratiot Co Sub Abuse Coalition – sticker shock event was held in October. Decoys in April and May. Students are hosting ATI awareness nights at basketball games. Prom commitment cards and partnering with local businesses if students sign pledge cards they will receive a discount.

Melissa – Luce County – Getting ready to do Strengthening Families program again. Start doing surveys in the schools. Building our coalition stronger. Recently applied for a grant that will help get

some kids involved in a media campaign. We still do the STAR Program.

Jim Gallant – Marquette County Suicide Prevention Coalition – we received a grant to work on suicide prevention. Suicide coalition is kind of a companion coalition. Working on coordinating stakeholders in Marquette County and with all counties in Michigan.

Lisa Coleman – Region 10 Prevention Coordinator. Received partnership for success grant for Genesee County. Lisa will be leading the team to plan the Shoalition Showcase again.

Stephanie VanDerKooi – Region 3. 7 counties in west Michigan. 3 Partnership for Success grants. Mason, lake, and one more county. Muskegon community trials program and are considering doing this in some other counties. Talksooner.org and multiple apps. Teaching parents how to talk to your kids about drugs. Another campaign, “No matter how you feel about it, marijuana is still bad for kids.” Starting Media campaign in march.

Yvonne – LTBB – we also received a partnership for success grant. Gearing up for our year end celebration. About 120 youth attend from the schools. Parents who host lose the most campaign. Implementing our Paddling into New Generations program.

Audrey – intern at guidance center. Mainly working with SUDDS teen coalition in Southgate. Currently working on creating a video to uncover the myths of marijuana. Attend a leadership training in December.

Janine Kravetz – Bay County also received Partnership for Success grant. Trained in community trials. Coffee crawl had about 50 people. 4 coffee shops, spent about an hour at each coffee shop. Planning another one in April. Two summits on heroin and more are being planned. February 6 participating with Spirit hockey team for “Mental Health” night. Youth subcommittee is also participating in town hall meeting.
